Re: **FUEL PUMP SAFETY RECALL: NHTSA CAMPAIGN NUMBER: 13E-043**

THIS NOTICE IS SENT TO YOU IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE NATIONAL TRAFFIC AND MOTOR VEHICLE SAFETY ACT. Airtex Products, LP has determined that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in certain E3591M Electrical Fuel Pumps (“Fuel Pumps”). Specifically, Fuel Pumps purchased from Airtex between **Jun 10, 2013 and July 29, 2013** and which are marked with dated codes **243, 263, 283** and **293** on their packaging (see Figures A & B below) may be defective: (“Date Code”). For your reference, Figure A depicts the location of the label on the Fuel Pump Packaging, while Figure B depicts the location of the date code on the label.

Airtex has determined that a defect in the design of the Fuel Pump may cause the fuel tank in which it has been installed to leak gasoline. The Fuel Pumps fit the Chevrolet Malibu (2004-2008), the Pontiac G6 (2005-2008) and Saturn Aura (2007-2008). Connector tabs of the electrical connector components may not be of proper design. This condition may cause the connectors to fail to engage or properly align in the fuel pump fuselage. If a connector fails to engage or align, the connector will not properly seal. If the pump does not properly seal, fuel may escape the fuel tank, particularly when it is full.

Our Remedy

Airtex will replace Fuel Pumps with an applicable Date Code for conforming fuel pumps at no charge. Please call the Airtex Customer Service Line at **1-800-880-3056** for claims

processing instructions and assistance. The Customer Service Department is staffed between 7:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., central, Monday through Friday.

Complaints
