**Re: Amended 6<sup>th</sup> Quarterly Report - NHTSA Campaign No. 08V-161 /Hyundai Campaign No. 083**

Associate Administrator for Enforcement:

This amended report is being sent to include additional information regarding the subject campaign. This campaign involved the 2006 – 2008 Hyundai Sonata, and was conducted to reprogram the front passenger seat Occupant Classification System on a customer-requested basis only. The reprogramming is not necessary for vehicles which recognize and properly classify a small stature adult front passenger.

Hyundai Motor America submitted its initial 6<sup>th</sup> quarterly report on 10/29/09 for purposes of compliance with the quarterly reporting requirements of 49 C.F.R. Section 573.7. The information below was submitted for the calendar quarter ending September 30, 2009.

The following information is identified by and in the order of the paragraph headings of Section 573.7(b):

- (1) The notification campaign number assigned by NHTSA: **No. 08V-161.**
- (2) Date notification began and the date completed: **Notification to consumers began June 02, 2008 and was completed on October 27, 2008.**

- b) The number repaired: 10,470

(5) The number of vehicles determined to be unreachable for inspection due to export, theft, scrapping, failure to receive notification or other reasons (specify). The number of vehicles or items of equipment in each category shall be specified: **As of September 30, 2009 the number of vehicles determined to be unreachable for inspection due to:**

- a) Export: 0
- b) Theft: 0
- c) Scrapping: 3
- d) Failure to receive notice: 9,106
