

## **OWNER'S LETTER**

Dear Nissan Owner:

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act. Nissan has decided that some 2007 and 2008 Model year Nissan Armada vehicles fail to conform with one of the requirements in Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard (FMVSS) No. 210, Seat belt assembly anchorages.

### **Reason for Recall**

FMVSS No. 210 specifies certain requirements for seat belt assembly anchorages to insure their proper location for effective occupant restraint and to reduce the likelihood of their failure. The driver's side third row outboard shoulder harness anchor in some 2007 and 2008 Armada vehicles may not meet the strength requirement in this standard. A variance during manufacturing could result in a crack forming in the bracket during the stamping process. If the bracket has a crack in it, there is an increased risk that it could fail during a crash, increasing the potential risk of injury.

### **What Nissan Will Do**

Your Nissan dealer will replace the driver's side third row seat belt bracket assembly to ensure that the standard is met. This free service should take about 1 hour to complete, but your Nissan dealer may require your vehicle for a longer period of time based upon their work schedule.

### **What You Should Do**

Contact your Nissan dealer at your earliest convenience in order to arrange an appointment to have your vehicle repaired. Please bring this notice with you when you keep your service appointment. Instructions have been sent to your Nissan dealer.
