SAFETY RECALL NOTICE
NHTSA Campaign No. 13T-003

Dear Valued Federal Tire Customer:

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Federal Corporation has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in certain Federal Couragia A/T P265/75R16 116S tires built from the 32nd week of 2010 through the 8th week of 2013 identified as specified below. The tire serial numbers can be found after the letters "DOT" on the tire sidewall. Federal Corporation is recalling approximately 8,513 of these tires in the United States. Only tires manufactured during this period of time are involved in this campaign.

You are receiving this letter because our records indicate that you are the potential owner of the affected tire that is the subject of this tire recall campaign. Federal Corporation is recalling the subject tires with the identification numbers listed above because of partial tread shoulder chunking during endurance testing. Continued driving on the subject tire could lead to eventual tire failure increasing the risk of a crash.



We are conducting this campaign to ensure your safety and satisfaction with your Federal tire.

If you own an affected tire, please take this letter and your vehicle to the tire dealer from whom you purchased the tire as soon as possible. If the inspection verifies that you have a tire(s) with the above identification numbers, they will be replaced, mounted and, if needed, balanced at no charge to you if you have presented them for remedy within 31st August 2013. It is expected that replacement tires will be available at 1st June 2013 the time of inspection. However, if the tires are not available at the time of inspection, they will be available within (30 days). After 1st September 2013, tires will be replaced under Federal's normal adjustment policy.
