IMPORTANT SAFETY RECALL

NHTSA RECALL 13V-430

Dear Infiniti M Owner:

This interim notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act. Infiniti has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in certain 2006 through 2010 Model year Infiniti M vehicles. Our records indicate that you own the Infiniti vehicle identified by the VIN on the inside of this notice.

Reason for Recall

On some of the affected vehicles, an accelerator pedal sensor issue may cause the vehicle to slow down (go into "limp home" mode), and in rare instances, the engine may stop running while the vehicle is coming to a stop. If this issue occurs, it may increase the risk of a crash.

What Infiniti Will Do

Your Infiniti retailer will replace the accelerator assembly and reprogram the Electronic Control Module in your vehicle free of charge for parts and labor.

What You Should Do

Infiniti is currently developing the remedy to address this issue. Later this fall, Infiniti will send you a second letter asking you to bring your vehicle to an Infiniti retailer for a remedy. Until that time, you can continue operating your vehicle normally unless the Malfunction Indicator Lamp (MIL) in vehicle is illuminated. **If the MIL is illuminated, contact your Infiniti retailer immediately and it will make arrangements for an immediate repair. Do not continue using your vehicle with the MIL illuminated.**
