2. (a) The date notification to purchasers began: Fastec began notifying its direct end user customers (approximately 18,368 customers) of the recall on or about September 10, 2013. On or about September 19, 2013, Fastec and WESCO posted notice of the recall on their respective internet websites. Additionally, based on information supplied to Fastec by its OEM RV industry customers, Fastec has thus far sent approximately 452,050 NHTSA-approved notifications to end-users and others who may potentially be affected by the recall.

(b) The date notification of purchasers was completed: Fastec completed the mailing of its NHTSA-approved recall notice to its direct end-user customers on or about October 4, 2013. Fastec continues to work with its OEM RV industry customers in an ongoing effort to gather additional names of RV owners and others who may potentially be affected by the recall so that notice of the recall can be provided to them as well. As information is obtained and mailings are processed, Fastec has been notifying NHTSA accordingly and providing the applicable notifications to NHTSA for its records. Fastec will continue to do so until all applicable mailings are completed.

3. The total number of items of equipment involved: Fastec estimates that approximately 1.1 million locksets could potentially be affected by the recall.

4. (a) Total number inspected and remedied: As of June 30, 2014, approximately 22,411 end users have contacted Fastec (via the company's internet website and/or 800#) concerning the recall, and approximately 17,253 replacement cylinder sets and/or locksets have been provided to affected end users. See attached summary for additional details. Fastec has also previously inspected 166,798 locksets in its inventory and remedied any affected locksets prior to distribution and sale to others.

(b) Total number inspected, but determined NOT to require the remedy: As of June 30, 2014 approximately 22,411 end users have contacted Fastec (via the company's internet website and/or 800#) concerning the recall, and approximately 5,158 of those end-users have indicated that they do not have a Fastec lock that is affected by the recall. See attached summary for additional details. Fastec has also previously inspected 166,798 locksets in its inventory and remedied any affected locksets prior to distribution and sale to others.

Fastec had a number of RV industry OEM customers who purchased hundreds of thousands of locksets during the recall period, but who are no longer in business. For example, Fastec sold more than 565,000 locksets to Phillips Products and similarly sold more than 558,000 locksets to Amerimax RV Door. Fastec has no way to reasonably determine which, if any, of these locksets may be affected by the recall, nor can Fastec reasonably determine who the end-users of these locksets may be. Additionally, a number of Fastec's RV industry OEM customers (and others with whom Fastec had no direct commercial dealings) have indicated that they are not participating in the recall, leaving Fastec no way to reasonably determine who the end-users of any locksets provided to those customers might be. Collectively, Fastec believes that the number of locksets sold to non-participating OEMs exceeds 408,000.
