Dear Ms. Lewis:

In connection with the above referenced matter, this supplements Toyota's Defect Information Report dated October 19, 2014 and is a follow up to our letter of November 10, 2014.

As noted previously, the geographic region involved in recall # 14V-655 originally identified as the Gulf Coast had been further clarified. It includes parts of adjacent counties to Florida in Southern Georgia, as well as the coastal areas of Alabama, Louisiana, Mississippi and Texas.

The number of Toyota and Lexus affected vehicles has been increased to reflect more accurately the vehicles that are to be remedied as part of recall # 14V-655. This is the result of additional analysis and newly received vehicle registration information from R.L. Polk that has caused us to move vehicles from recall #14V-312 to #14V-655. The updated number of vehicles involved in recall # 14V-655 is approximately 354,929. Specific model populations are listed below. (Pontiac Vibe information has not changed.)


The increased number is a result of specific vehicle populations that are now being remedied under recall # 14V-655 but originally involved in recall # 14V-312. Specifically, vehicles that are currently registered, were ever registered, or were originally sold in: Florida and adjacent counties in Southern Georgia, Puerto Rico, Hawaii, the U. S. Virgin Islands, Guam, Saipan, American Samoa, as well as the coastal areas of Alabama, Louisiana, Mississippi and Texas, will now be reported as part of #14V-655. Also, as discussed with NHTSA's Recall Management Division, some additional Sequoia vehicles have been included in the revised numbers that had been inadvertently omitted from the inclusive production ranges previously reported. RMD requested that the vehicle populations in # 14V-312 and #14V-655 be reported separately.
