



SAFETY RECALL STOP SALE NOTICE

To our Customers:

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

On April 3, 2015, Lippert Components, Inc. ("LCI"), notified the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), pursuant to 49 CFR 573, that it has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety may exist in certain 12" and 10" brake hubs manufactured by TRP International, Inc. identified as Tru Ryde and incorporated into LCI axles from Plant 45 in Indiana and Plant 57 in Idaho and sold to final stage manufacturers. This notification to NHTSA was made by filing the attached Defect Information Report. The scope, consequence and defect condition is detailed in the attached report.

We are giving you notice of this NHTSA filing because your company received shipment of axles possibly containing the brake hub assemblies that are within the recall population. The details of these shipments are attached, if not previously provided to you. You may have an independent obligation to notify NHTSA under 49 CFR 573 and we encourage you to consult with your legal advisors.

If the axles with these brake hubs assemblies are still in your inventory, you must not sell or install these assemblies. It is a violation of federal law to sell any of the assemblies covered by this recall to retail customers. If the axles were manufactured at LCI's Plant 45 in Indiana with a manufacturing date from March 11, 2015 to March 27, 2015 and identified as having a Tru Ryde 12" hub incorporated into the axle, neither the axle nor the recreational vehicle or trailer containing such axle may be sold. If the axles were manufactured at LCI's Plant 57 in Idaho with a manufacturing date from February 16, to April 9, 2015 and identified as having a Tru Ryde 10" or 12" hub incorporated into the axle, neither the axle nor the recreational vehicle or trailer containing such axle may be sold. Included are Tru Ryde Hub Stud Breakage Identification and Repair sheets for each facility. Fig. 1 is an illustration to assist identifying the LCI plant location and manufacturing date.
